The 4th Bathinda flower festival will be held at the Sushant city-2 on 7th-8th march 2026 saturday & sunday.

All competitions will be held on 7th march Saturday and registrations for all competitions is free and registration, can be done at our website

The flower show competition will be open to all the government, semi-government private institutions and individuals.

The exhibits will be admitted without entry fee.

The exhibits of class A,D,E,G,I,K,M,N,O & Best out of waste will be arranged between 1.00 pm to 4.00pm on 6th march 2026. the exhibitors must vacate the exhibition premises by 5.00 pm.

Each entry must be labeled properly, showing class, section etc.

The exhibits which are not according to the specifications of class and section for which they are entered, will be disqualified.

The organizing committee will not be responsible for any error of exhibitors.

All possible care of exhibits will be taken but the organizing committee shall not be responsible for any damage to exhibits or loss of accessories. therefore, the participants should avoid the use of expensive material for flower arrangements.

The Floral dress competition class H will be held on the stage at the given time.

The exhibits in pots and vases shall be returned to the exhibitors on the evening of 8th march 2026 after the prize distribution at 4:00 pm.

No prizes will be awarded if the number of competitors in any section are less than three. however, the decision of the committee will be final.

It will be within the discretion of judges not to award any prizes is a section where the exhibits are not up to the standard. The decision of the organizing committee of the flower show will be final and binding.

The short listed entries in class-P will be personally visited by the judges to select a winner.

One entry per person, per class, per section will be permitted otherwise prize will not be awarded.

No competitor shall be allowed to be a judge in a section where he is one of the participants.

Flower arrangements will be done on the spot in class d. however, no other person will be permitted to help the competitor in making flower arrangement.

In Class B flower ornaments, Class C flower rangoli, Class F Painting with flowers & Class M Pot arrangement will be prepared on the spot.

The material pertaining to flower show may be collected immediately after flower show. every care will be taken for the exhibits, however, organizers will not be responsible for loss of material / exhibits.

The prize distribution will be held on 8th march sunday at 4.00 pm. the winners should reach near the stage by 3.30 pm.

The matters not covered above shall be left to the discretion of the organizing committee whose decision will be final and binding.


